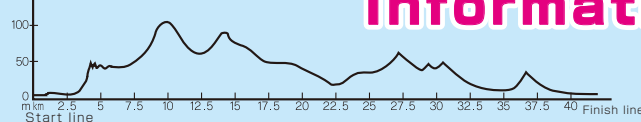

Rough waves on the East China Sea throw spray high into the air along the long, narrow rocky coast of Nagasaki Bay, the southernmost point on the Satsuma Peninsula. The area, which figures in the legend of Urashima Taro, offers beautiful views of Mt. Kaimon.

With a circumference of 15 kilometers and a depth of 233 meters, Lake Ikeda is Kyushu's largest lake. It's home to large eels and a mythical monster named Isshi.

With an elevation of 924 meters, Mt. Kaimon, a double volcano of striking beauty, is known as the "Satsuma Fuji." Its summit, which can be climbed in two hours, offers panoramic views.
